"Now I am sure that the Lord has rescued me from the hand of Herod."

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

In those days: Herod the King laid violent hands upon some who belonged to the Church. He killed James the brother of John with the sword; and when he saw that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to arrest Peter also. This was during the days of Unleavened Bread. And when he had seized him, he put him in prison, and delivered him to four squads of soldiers to guard him, intending after the Passover to bring him out to the people. So Peter was kept in prison; but earnest prayer for him was made to God by the Church. The very night when Herod was about to bring him out, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains, and sentries before the door were guarding the prison; and behold, an angel of the Lord appeared, and a light shone in the cell; and he struck Peter on the side and woke him, saying, "Get up quickly." And the angel said to him, "Dress yourself and put on your sandals." And chains fell off his hands. And he did so. And he said to him, "Wrap your cloak around you and follow me." And he went out and followed him; he did not know that what was done by the angel was real, but thought he was seeing a vision. When they had passed the first and the second guard, they came to the Iron gate leading into the city. It opened to them of its own accord, and they went out and passed on through one street; and immediately the angel left him. And Peter came to himself, and said, "Now I am sure that the Lord has sent his angel and rescued me from the hand of Herod and from all that the Jewish people were expecting."

RESPONSORIAL PSALM


Psalm 34:29 (R) 5

PRECEPTS OF THE CHURCH

- The church is the Mother and Teacher, so she teaches guides and disciplines her children, the Christians. The precepts of the church are duties that the Catholic Church requires of all the faithful.
- The precepts of the Church are set in the context of a moral life bound to and nourished by liturgical life. The obligatory character of these positive laws decreed by the pastoral authorities is meant to guarantee to the faithful the indispensable minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2041)
- The church uses these precepts to remind us that Christian life requires a commitment to prayer and active participation in the Liturgy and Sacraments. If we fall below this bare-minimum level, we cannot rightly consider ourselves to be in communion with the Catholic Church.

FIRST PRECEPT: "You shall attend Mass on Sundays [the day of the Lord's Resurrection] and holy days of obligation."

The first precept requires the faithful to participate in the Eucharistic celebration when the Christian community gathers together on the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord. This means to worship God by participating in mass every Sunday and every holy day of obligation: to avoid those activities that would hinder renewal of soul and body, for example, needless work and business activities, unnecessary shopping, and so forth. Holiday of obligation are special feasts on which Catholics who have reached the age of reason are seriously obliged, as on Sundays, to attend mass and avoid unnecessary work. Time spent with family, saying a family rosary, watching a religious program on TV, sharing a meal with relatives is very important and fulfills the intent of this precept. The main intent of this precept is to ensure that we obey the commandment to "keep holy the Lord's Day". Serious reasons excuse us from these obligations. In Kenya these days are: Ascension of the Lord, Assumption of Mary, All saints day and Christmas day. Most of the times when the feast and Solemnities of our Lord Jesus Christ fall on week days, the Church celebrates them on the Sunday that follows so as to allow all to enjoy full participation.
