### GOSPEL

#### John: 1:6-8.19-28

## "Among you stands one whom you do not know." A reading from the holy Gospel according to John



here was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came for testimony, to bear witness to the light, that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness to the light. And this is the testimony of John, when the Jews sent priest and Levities from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" He confessed, he did not deny, but confess, "I am not the Christ." And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the prophet?" And he answered, "No." They said to him, then, "Who are you? Let us have an answer for those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" He said, "I am the

voice crying in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,' as the prophet Isaiah said.

Now they had been sent from the Pharisees. They asked him, "Then why are you baptizing, if you are neither the Christ nor Elijah, nor the prophet?" John answered them, "I baptize with water, but among you stands one whom you do not know, even he who comes after me, the thong of whose sandal I am not worthy to untie." This took place in Bethany beyond Jordan, where John was baptizing.

#### LIGHTING THE THIRD CANDLE OF THE ADVENT WREATH

On the third Sunday of Advent the pink or rose-colored candle is lit. This pink candle is customarily called the "Shepherds Candle" and it represents JOY. During this Sunday, the readings lead us to be happy trusting in the realization of the Promise of God, in the coming of Jesus Christ. The source of our Joy is He, and in Him we find strength and real light to our lives.

During this week the father prays:

"O Lord, we beg You, incline your ear to our prayers and enlighten the darkness of our minds by the grace of your visitation.

Who lives and reigns forever. Amen."

The mother then lights the two previously lit purple candles plus the rose candle.

O Key of David, Jesus Christ, the gates of heaven open at your command,

Come and show us the way to salvation.

You can also...

Light the 1st purple candle (repeat 1st week's prayer)

Light the 2nd purple candle (repeat 2nd week's prayer)

Light the rose candle (recite the prayers above)

### REFLECTION

### ONE WHO IS COMING by Scott Hahn, Ph.D.

The mysterious figure of John the Baptist, introduced in last week's readings, comes into sharper focus today. Who he is, we see in today's Gospel, is best understood by who he isn't. He is not Elijah returned from the heavens, although like him he dresses in the prophet's attire and preaches repentance and judgment. Not Elijah in the flesh, John is nonetheless sent in the spirit and power of Elijah to fulfill his mission. Neither is John the prophet Moses foretold, although he is a kinsman and speaks God's word. Nor is John the Messiah, though he has been anointed by the Spirit since the womb. John prepares the way for the Lord. His baptism is symbolic, not sacramental. It is a sign given to stir our hearts to repentance. John shows us the One upon whom the Spirit remains, the One who fulfills the promise we hear in today's First Reading. Jesus' bath of rebirth and the Spirit opens a fountain that purifies Israel and gives to all a new heart and a new Spirit. John comes to us in the Advent readings to show us the light, that we might believe in the One who comes at Christmas. As we sing in today's Responsorial, the Mighty One has come to lift each of us up, to fill our hunger with bread from heaven. And as Paul exhorts in today's Epistle, we should rejoice, give thanks, and pray without ceasing that God will make us perfectly holy in spirit, soul, and body - that we may be blameless when our Lord comes.
